### **Book Projects in Process**

*The Origin of the Roman Canon and its Use of Sacred Scripture*. This is the first introduction to the origin of Roman Canon in any language since the Second Vatican Council. It will explore all the primary source material for the central eucharistic prayer in the Latin West, along with all the possible references or allusions to the text in the extant literature. The project's multi-disciplinary approach situates the text within the wider transition from Greek to Latin and its relationship to the array of other early Christian anaphoras, all the while attending to its use of Scripture, a topic that has not received any sustained scholarly treatment.

*An Anglican Liturgical Handbook: A Theological and Ceremonial Guide, and the Ritual Reasons Why*. This high-illustrated and photographed book will be a detailed ceremonial guide that engages the major sources for ceremony for the 1979 American BCP and provides detailed explanations and history for readers of all backgrounds.

*A History of the English and American Prayer Books: An Introduction for Students*. This monograph will be an accessible introduction to the history, content, and theology of the English and American Prayer Books.

*Doxology, Sacrifice, Glory: A New Vision of Worship for People Who Don't Read Books Like That*. This book is directed toward a non-technical audience and is meant to be a popular introduction to several topics that have occupied my scholarly work. The book will explore the vision of sacrifice in the Old and New Testaments and its reception by early Christians, ways to think about Christian sacrifice that gets beyond reformation-era debates, and then provides a vision of what it looks like to embrace such a vision for modern Anglicans, including practical advice for how church's worship on Sundays.
