Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund – student disclosure

- 1. Nashotah House has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement to the Department of Education for funding under the CRRSAA and ARP programs. These programs allow for grants to students through the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF).
- 2. Nashotah House is approved for \$8,438 in funding from CRRSAA (HEERF II) and \$12,738 in funding from ARP (HEERF III). \$21,176 total funding for students.
- 3. \$21,176 has been distributed to students.
- 4. 144 students were eligible to participate.
- 5. 28 students have received a HEERF II or HEERF III Emergency Financial Aid Grant.
- 6. All students enrolled during the Spring 2021, Summer 2021, or Fall 2021 semester were invited to submit a signed affidavit detailing their exceptional financial need. Grants were distributed based on the number of credits enrolled. For Spring 2022 semester, the remaining HEERF funds were distributed to residential students demonstrating remaining financial need. For students who did not authorize applying the funds to their tuition account, refunds were generated for direct payment through bill.com.
- 7. Students were advised they may use an emergency grant to pay for any component of the their cost of attendance, including an outstanding account balance and/or tuition and fees, as well as for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.
