

Certificate in Anglican Ministry

FORMED FOR MINISTRY

The Certificate in Anglican Ministry is a 6-credit program that focuses upon those elements of ministry training which are distinctive to the Anglican tradition. Ordinarily, students in the CAM come to Anglican ministry after a season of formation and/ or ministry in a different tradition, and this certificate provides a foundation in areas of ministry and history from a classic Anglican context. Focus areas of the CAM include leading worship according to the Book of Common Prayer, Anglican history, Holy Orders, theology, ecclesiology, and applying an Anglican ethos in personal ministry.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Hybrid-distance format, including 18 synchronous online class sessions.

A one-week liturgics intensive on our historic lakeside campus for hands-on experience leading Anglican worship, twice-daily worship in St. Mary's Chapel, meals eaten in community, and evenings for study and/or fellowship.

Access to all Frances Donaldson Library resources: 110,000 print volumes, 50,000 e-books, and millions of digital journal articles

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students seeking admission to the Certificate in Anglican Ministry will ordinarily hold a Master of Divinity or its equivalent. All applicants without a prior graduate degree must have completed at least one year of graduate-level coursework.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

Nashotah House offers six degrees & two certificates in three educational programs

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

Residential students live on the historic, family-friendly, wooded campus overlooking Upper Nashotah Lake in the heart of Wisconsin's lake country. Students are formed to embrace a life of discipline through daily worship and Scripture reading, study of the great thinkers of the church in their own words, and learn to imitate the Lord in serving others, all in the context of a vibrant community that offers countless opportunities for fellowship and deep, lasting friendships. All residential degrees are designed with an expected start in the Fall Term.

HYBRID-DISTANCE PROGRAM

The Hybrid-Distance Program is designed for those seeking the riches of communal formation but for whom relocation into a full-time residential program is not an option. Students spend time physically on campus praying, learning, and connecting as part of the wider Nashotah community and as a community among themselves.

Hybrid-Distance students take seven courses (21 credits) in succession (nonoverlapping) during an academic year. Summer, Fall, and Spring terms include one six-week distance course with no residential component and one hybrid course, where students are on campus for one intensive residential week and then finish the remainder of the six-week course online. The Winter (four-week) term has one course in the hybrid format. Thus, hybrid-distance students are on campus for four weeks per academic year: July, November, January, and April.

The Hybrid-Distance program is designed with an optimal start in the Summer term, though Nashotah House permits applications for admission to any term during the academic year. Application deadlines are April I (Summer), July I (Fall), November I (Winter), and December I (Spring). Please note: the Certificate in Anglican Ministry begins in the Fall term only and has a single residential week in February.

ADVANCED DEGREE PROGRAM

The Advanced Degree Program is for students interested in further pursuing professional and academic goals while being enriched by shared community life. Taught by Nashotah House faculty and visiting professors, Advanced Elective courses offer engagement with both course material and ministry peers. These topical courses are intentionally structured to provide an atmosphere in which excellent instruction and collegial interaction combine to provide genuine Doctor of Ministry (DMin) | 30 cr. professional growth. Scheduled regularly in Summer and Winter Terms and occasionally in Spring and Fall Terms, Advanced Elective courses are offered in the hybrid format with residential and online components.

The Master of Sacred Theology (STM) is an academic degree requiring 60 credits of prior seminary-level study. The Doctor of Ministry (DMin) is a professional degree requiring 72 credits of prior seminary-level study. Advanced Degree students are encouraged to begin their coursework in either Summer or Winter Terms.
